Rick founded POSITIVE EXPOSURE after a chance encounter in 1997 with a young lady living with albinism at a bus stop in New York City. As an artist, Rick was taken by her extraordinary beauty. In a quest for a better understanding of albinism, Rick sought out medical textbooks, where he was affronted by the dehumanizing images depicting disease, lacking all humanity. It was this experience which forced Rick to turn his lens from the more traditional ideas of beauty, to the beauty and richness of human diversity. Smiles United is a virtual model of care aiming to help people with intellectual and developmental disabilities overcome barriers to oral health care. The Touro College of Dental Medicine team aims to diminish the barriers to treatment by virtually connecting group homes and caregivers with their team of compassionate oral health care providers. The model of support, which is funded by grants from the Developmental Disabilities Planning Council (DDPC), provides group homes and caregivers with educational video training modules that explain and demonstrate helpful techniques for maintaining the oral health of residents.

With experience in dental care for patients with intellectual, developmental and acquired disabilities, she developed TCDM's special care dental education program and serves as Course Director of Oral Health Care for Patients with Special Needs Rotation, the result of Dr. DiSenso-Browne's collaborative efforts in establishing an affiliation between TCDM and WIHD. The rotation provides dental students a unique educational experience to work with individuals with developmental disabilities and their dental providers. Dr. DiSenso-Browne sits on the New York Academic Dental Centers (NYSADC) Fellowship Advisory Committee, where she assisted in developing the NYSADC Fellowship and Scholarship Programs to Address Oral Health Disparities, supporting a Fellow at each NYS dental school for training in special care dentistry. She is co-Director of the Special Needs Dentistry Fellowship at TCDM. She also is co-architect and manager of the TCDM Special Care Dentistry Continuing Education Series with support from NYS OPWDD Task Force on Special Dentistry, a free live webinar series for multidisciplinary guest speakers to lecture on various challenges and opportunities in the care of individuals with intellectual, developmental, and acquired disabilities.

In addition to her teaching responsibilities at TCDM, Dr. DiSenso-Browne is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Cell Biology & Anatomy in the School of Medicine at NYMC. Dr. DiSenso-Browne is licensed to practice in the state of New York.

SAMANTHA FLETCHER, PhD, MSW & TYLER FLETCHER



Since entering the field of social work, Samantha "Sam" Fletcher, Ph.D., MSW, has served in a variety of positions. She was the project coordinator and senior research assistant for the New York State PFC Joseph P. Dwyer Statewide Veteran Peer Support Program evaluation. Then, she served as the Assistant Dean of Academic Programs in the School of Social Welfare at the University at Albany where she worked with a diverse team to provide a quality education for social work students. Sam joined the National Association of Social Workers, New York State (NASW-NYS) chapter in September 2019. Along with her colleagues and volunteers, she has worked to create an inclusive chapter that is representative of social workers across the state. The team restructured the chapter's advocacy structure that is now led by NASW-NYS members; increased continuing education opportunities; transformed the Veterans Mental Health Training Initiative to train thousands of social workers in New York about military culture; created the *This is Social Work* initiative; started multiple special interest groups; and developed multiple racial justice and LGBTQ+ initiatives designed to educate and transform the profession of social work.

Sam and her 22-year-old son, Tyler, have been training social workers as well as medical and mental health graduate students on the lived experience of people with developmental disorders and mental health challenges since 2014. Tyler was adopted at 10 days old. Throughout his life he has maintained a relationship with his birth family. Tyler graduated high school in 2019 and currently works at Stewarts. Tyler is enrolled in the OPWDD self-direction program. He has worked hard to implement a wellness plan that allows him to have a high quality of life while managing symptoms of autism and bi-polar. Part of Tyler's wellness plan includes sharing his story with peers and providers.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER - DAY 2

KIMBERLY HILL RIDLEY



Kim was appointed by Governor Kathy Hochul to serve as New York State's first-ever Chief Disability Officer (CDO) on February 14, 2022 - the same day that New York's Office of the Chief Disability Officer was created in law within the Executive Chamber, making it one of the first states in the country to establish such an office. Kim has been charged with advising the Governor and executive staff on policy and budgetary issues as they pertain to disability issues, serving as the state's ADA Coordinator and chairing New York's Most Integrated Services Coordinating Council, which is responsible for the state's Olmstead compliance.

As CDO, Kim and her team spend a significant amount of their time meeting with advocates, people with disabilities and their families, focusing on priority topics such as home care, employment, housing, accessibility and transportation and collaborating with state agencies to reduce the silos that exist within the many existing service delivery systems in New York State.

Prior to joining the Executive Chamber, Kim served as the Principal Analyst for the New York State Assembly Standing Committee on People with Disabilities, which focuses primarily on people with intellectual or developmental disabilities. Previously, Kim served as Director of the Assembly Task Force on People with Disabilities, which focused on issues pertaining primarily to people with physical and sensory disabilities.

Kim holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Utica College of Syracuse University and resides in Latham, NY with her husband, Michael, and her two children, Michaela and Alex.

MARIA KANSAS, MD



Dr. Maria Kansas is the Chief Medical Officer for the Center for Disability Services in Albany. She is a board-certified Family Physician since 1989 and specializes in care for individuals and families across the lifespan. BENJAMIN MARGOLIS, MD




